2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.		<p>To overcome the unexpected interruption and restrictions caused by COVID-19 pandemic, the University has taken several measures to complete the syllabus of courses and programs. The university followed the instructions received from UGC, MHRD and State Government and was able to transform formal education into online education.</p> <p>The university has constituted a separate committee comprising of faculty members who are well-versed with digital learning. This committee facilitated training for all other faculty members of the institute on online teaching, usage of various online teaching learning tools and LMS platforms. Some of the faculty also attended technology-based teaching programmes conducted by different universities.</p> <p>Faculty prepared e-materials for the prescribed syllabus and took online classes as per timetable. The study materials were also uploaded on LMS portal. The recorded video lectures were also made available on LMS portal for those who missed the classes due to some unavoidable circumstances. Some of the faculty followed flipped classroom concept, wherein a day before they uploaded the module what they needed to teach and took online classes which were focused more on discussion on the topic and clearing the doubts of students.</p> <p>Assignments and quizzes were also posted by faculty regularly for continuous internal evaluation of students.</p> <p>The University has created smart class rooms and also provided digital boards to faculty as an alternative to blackboard so that faculty can clearly write and explain the concepts to students which actually provided a live experience of class to them. Students were able to interact with faculty during the sessions and they felt that the online tool has shown the simplest way to chat with faculty for clearing their doubts.</p> <p>The University has also procured a number of cameras to videotape the faculty lectures for live streaming of classes.</p> <p>With all the above efforts and continuous follow-up, faculty members were able to complete the syllabus of all the courses and programs on time.</p>
